

## **West Homestead Community Day Meeting Summary**

## **Particulars:**

Saturday, August 13th, 2022 4 p.m. to TBD Calhoun Community Park

## **Purpose:**

Pashek+MTR attended West Homestead Community Day to collect community feedback regarding the four key issues that will inform the implementation stage of the comprehensive plan process. Residents filled out a short survey based on the key issues and informed the consultant what they love about their community.

A summary of takeaways from the meeting is provided below.

## Takeaways:

- What would you improve about your neighborhood?
  - The most frequently mentioned comment was traffic improvements such as speed bumps and other traffic slowing measures.
    - Example: Between Fieldstone and Pinewood (stop sign does not help)
  - Park improvements at Calhoun Community Park were also frequently mentioned. Specific improvements included a better track, larger pavilion, grass clippings compost, and the ballfield.
  - Other comments included:
    - Increased public safety in the form of increased police presence or community neighborhood watch
    - Increased access to the Waterfront
    - More community engagement
    - Lower school taxes
- What would make it easier to get around your community?
  - Suggestions regarding connectivity in West Homestead included:
    - More speed bumps to slow down drivers
    - More bus stops
    - A community shuttle or bus
- How can the Steel Valley communities work together better?
  - Suggestions for bringing the Steel Valley communities included:
    - More community events that bridge the boroughs
      - Parades
      - Steel Valley nights for the communities
        - BINGO, concerts, etc.

- o Farmers' markets
- Getting all of the communities to understand that each one of them have strengths
- Have all three communities work together on projects
- Consolidate community services such as the police forces
- How can we include residents and business owners in the growth of Steel Valley?
  - Suggestions to include residents and businesses in the growth of Steel Valley included
    - More communication between the communities and residents such as:
      - Community meetings (with residents and business owners)
      - More newsletters
      - A phone chain
    - Sale days at local businesses
    - More involvement from the Waterfront
      - Example: Support Rivers of Steel Live Fridays with better marketing
    - More new businesses
    - Community events such as gardens, movie nights, and fairs
    - Volunteer programs
- What do you love about West Homestead?
